

SUPERVISED VISITATION PERSONNEL:

Child safety is everyone's job!

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- Assess the child's safety.
- Tell the child you are glad he/she told you.
- Get down to the child's level to listen.
- Consult with a supervisor.

What
Information
is Helpful When
Making a Call?

- 1. Child's name
- 2. Addresses and phone numbers for the family
- 3. Your name and contact information

- Tell anyone (other than the Hotline Counselor and your supervisor) what the child told you.
- React with shock or fear.
- Push for details that the child may not feel ready to share.
- Doubt your instincts or the child's word.
